TEXANS STEP UP FOR HEALTH: COMMUNITY CHALLENGE CLOSES WITH RECORD WINS AND A NEW AWARD HONORING LEGACY LEADERSHIP

AUSTIN, TX – April 25, 2025 The 13th annual *Community Challenge* has wrapped up with record participation, statewide celebrations, and a renewed commitment to building a healthier Texas. Organized by Healthier Texas, the eight-week competition engaged residents, schools, organizations, and local leaders across the state to log healthy activities and support community-wide wellness.

This year's Challenge saw standout performances from metro cities, border towns, and rural communities alike, highlighting how every region of Texas is rising to meet the moment with creativity, energy, and collaboration.

San Antonio Takes the Gold – Again

A major highlight of the 2025 Challenge was **San Antonio's 10th win** in the Metro category – a first in the program's history. With over **1,200 participants**, the city logged more than **12 million points**, **15,800 miles**, and **815,000 minutes** of physical activity, earning the **state champion title for the third consecutive year**.

"This is more than an award – it's a testament to what's possible when we center health in our work as public servants," said **Mayor Ron Nirenberg**. "I am honored to accept this recognition on behalf of the entire San Antonio community. Our city has shown year after year what we can accomplish when we move together – literally and figuratively – for a healthier future."

Honoring Leadership: The Nirenberg Community Health Leader Award

To mark this milestone, Healthier Texas introduced a new annual award: the **Nirenberg Community Health Leader Award**. Named for Mayor Nirenberg, the award will honor one exceptional Texas leader each year whose commitment to public health reflects the Mayor's legacy of inclusive, community-centered action.

"To have this award reflect a cause so close to my heart – health and fitness for all – is incredibly meaningful," Nirenberg shared. "I share it with everyone who has contributed to this work over the years."

"This award is about more than a single person – it's about inspiring others to step up for the health of their communities," added **Jamie Williams**, CEO of Healthier Texas. "Mayor Nirenberg

has demonstrated what leadership rooted in wellness, equity, and consistency looks like. We are proud to carry his legacy forward through this annual recognition."

Statewide Success Stories

From bustling metros to rural towns, Texans rallied together to track healthy habits, host local events, and empower neighbors to take action. Participation came not only from individuals, but also from entire school districts, employer teams, city governments, and public health partners.

"The Community Challenge is more than a competition – it's a reflection of the strength and resilience of our state," said **Jamie Williams**, CEO of Healthier Texas. "Texas is growing fast. By 2045, one in seven Americans will call Texas home. How we support the health of our people today will shape the future of our schools, our economy, and our neighborhoods. These communities are proving that health isn't a luxury – it's a shared responsibility."

Community Challenge participant Cecilia Fernandez of San Antonio shared how the experience made a lasting difference in her daily life. "It has taught me discipline and endurance to practice healthy eating, drinking plenty of water and exercise makes for a happy mind and a happy person."

Highlights from Across the State

- Pharr (Mid-Sized 1st place) logged 6.2 million points with more than 1,000 participants. Community Champion Vanessa Soto organized 17 wellness events. Top performer Napoleon Daniel Coca recorded 4,450 minutes of activity and 119 referrals.
- **McAllen** (Large 1st place) reclaimed the top spot with strong participation across public entities and schools.
- **Stockdale** (Extra Small 1st place) led both community and school district categories an example of how rural communities can achieve outsized impact through collaboration.
- **Harlingen** (Mid-Sized 3rd & School District 1st) united municipal and school efforts for a double win, backed by enthusiastic student, staff, and family participation.



- North East ISD (Metro 1st place) helped fuel San Antonio's success by rallying over 800 participants across campuses and neighborhoods.
- Alamo, Edinburg, San Juan, Baytown, and Laredo also made strong showings proof that diverse communities across the state are finding local solutions to improve health outcomes.

"Every healthy choice, every walk logged, every community event helped Texans invest in themselves and one another," said **Amelia Carnagey**, Director of Marketing. "This collective energy is what turns a simple challenge into lasting change."
